Focus on New Friends



Jo Bell, moved to Oakland during the COVID crisis to care for her 90-year-old father. When he passed away on April Fool's Day she inherited his house.

Now the house in Ash Court is overflowing. Of Jo's five children, two of her daughters are living

with her, along with 3 grade-school-age grandchildren (Levi, Claire, & Scarlett,) and two dogs. Eric, who shares her house, is finding it all a bit overwhelming. Jo is praying for God's direction and provision for her daughter and grandkids.

Jo grew up attending a Methodist church in Vancouver, Washington. When she was a teen, one of her neighbors was from the Bible Belt. The neighbor introduced Jo to Focus on the Family, The Cross and The Switchblade, (a book about a gang member transformed by Jesus,) and Twixt Twelve and Twenty, (an advice book for teens by Pat Boone.) Twixt Twelve and Twenty made her hungry for a relationship with Christ. The neighbor also persuaded Jo to become involved with a Job's Daughters group. These were awesome years for Jo.

Jo's first husband, was in the Navy so she ended up in San Diego. While in San Diego she attended a Methodist church that had some spiritual people in it. Jo was baptized in her early 20's.

After the Navy, Jo's husband found himself in a dead-end job, so they moved up to Vancouver to be closer to family and friends. There he found a really good job. While in Vancouver, Jo had a home daycare business. It was very successful. She had wonderful kids.

Jo joined an interdenominational prayer group. The group believed in praying for healing. Jo was in a lot of back pain until one day God healed her!

When an opportunity in her husband's field became available in San Diego they moved back. Back in San Diego, Jo was hired to be the Office Manager by a company that she had worked for four years earlier as a temp. The tiny family-owned and run manufacturing business was very accommodating of

her responsibilities as a mom. Jo worked for them for 13 years.

After her marriage ended in divorce, Jo married a man that she had met while attending Horizon Christian Fellowship San Diego. He had no plans to remarry after a bad first experience, but that was before he met Jo. With him, Jo had her 5th child. They were married for 21 years. Jo observed, "It was wonderful to be equally yoked." When he died, she inherited his property in the Mojave Desert. The house is very primitive, there is no well, and only solar electricity. They used to spend one week a month in the Mojave to work on it. Jo was homeschooling two of her girls at that time. The house has been damaged by earthquakes and wind, so it is not very livable now.

Jo and her family love the outdoors. At one time she did a lot of biking, she enjoys hiking, and she and Eric had fun floating the Umpqua River last summer.

In 2012, Jo's mom passed away on Halloween day; (it felt odd to pass out candy the same day.) Jo's daughter Hillary spent the next month with Jo's dad. OCC is within walking distance, so Hillary & her son attended OCC and became friends with Lindsey & Aaron Baimbridge. Hillary was just bubbling over about our church, so when Jo moved here in 2020 and she decided to go back to church, she came to OCC.

Jo compares OCC to her Methodist church in Vancouver: warm and welcoming, but doesn't smother her.
